Eligibility (TSR1)

Open to ACU licence/membership card holders, which must be presented when signing on. Parental consent forms must be completed for any rider under 18 years of age. Must also be a member of the club.

Insurance (TSR1)

This is the standard ACU Premier Insurance.

Entries

Entries will be taken on the morning of the event. A completed ACU entry form and entry fee must be received. ACU Trials membership card must be shown at signing on. Entry Fees are as follows:

Fire Extinguishers (TSR41)

There shall be at least one fire extinguisher at the start of each event, but it is encouraged that each rider has their own.

First Aid (TSR31/33)

It is encouraged that riders have their own First Aid Kit. One will be situated at the start of each event.

Dogs at events

Whilst dogs are not discouraged from attending Off Road Motorcycle Sport events, they are to be kept on a lead at all times. Owners are responsible for ensuring their dog is kept under control and are responsible for clearing up any fouling that may occur.

Additional Regulations

Winner of D class championship cannot move to C novice, when appropriate must move to C class.

C Novice class is for older beginners or novice riders of any age or capacity machine who do not wish to ride their prescribed age category and is for petrol powered standard and medium wheel machines.

Winner of C Novice class must move up the following season.

Rules as per ACU Regulations TSR22B - Non-Stop

- 0 Clean
- 1 Footing once
- 2 Footing twice
- 3 Footing more than twice
- 5 Failure
- 5 When requested by the rider rather than attempt the section
- 5 Entering a section before being called upon to do so by an official
- 10 Not attempting a section when called upon to do so by an official
- 10 For missing a section or failing to have a punch card marked

No interference from parents to assist with travel through a section (An exception will be made for beginners and E class if required)

No arguing with an observers decision

Sections must be completed in the correct order and correct number of laps unless specific permission given by the Clerk of the Course

2019 Age Categories

A Class born between 01.01.2002 and 31.12.2003

B Class born between 01.01.2004 and 31.12.2007

C Class born between 01.01.2008 and 31.12.2009

D Class born between 01.01.2010 and 31.12.2013

E Class Minimum age – 4 years and born after 01.01.2014

Note: To ride a Combustion engine machine the rider must have attained 6 years

Note: The rider must have attained 4 years at the date of the competition.

Engine Capacity/Wheel Size for Above Age Groups

The maximum permitted for machines used in the Age Groups set out in this Regulation are as follows:

A Class 125cc Mono or up to 250cc Tw inshock** combustion engine, and Electric up to 10bhp measured at the rear wheel.

B Class 125cc Mono or up to 250cc Tw inshock** combustion engine, and Electric up to 10bhp measured at the rear wheel.

** Tw inshock machines over 125cc must have twin rear suspension units and drum brakes as at the time of manufacture

C Class Standard Wheel 80cc combustion engine, and Electric up to 7bhp measured at the rear wheel

C Class Medium Wheel 80cc combustion engine Electric up to 7bhp measured at the rear wheel

D Class with Medium Wheel 80cc combustion engine Electric up to 7bhp measured at the rear wheel

D Class with Small Wheel 80cc Combustion Engine Electric up to 7bhp measured at the rear wheel

E Class Small wheel Electric powered machines up to 2bhp measured at the rear wheel.

Wheel sizes

Standard Wheel – 21" Front – 18" Rear

Medium Wheel – 19" Front – 17" Rear

Small Wheel – 16" Front – 14" Rear

In all cases the rider must always comply with the maximum capacity and wheel size for their actual age.

Clothing

In accordance with section TSR12 of the ACU Regulations suitable clothing must be worn. Clothing must cover legs and body and it is recommended that arms should also be covered. Boots of approximately knee length made of leather, rubber or plastic must be worn. The wearing of gloves is recommended.

Helmets must be correctly fitted and worn at all times during the event. Cameras are not permitted.

All youth competitors must have clothing covering arms and wear gloves covering hands and fingers.
